1	<b>Davis Garrison Site (sign)</b> <i>Hint: hike the trail at Wagon Hill Farm along the water until you find the Old Gravel Pit</i>
2	<b>DHA Museum (brick building)</b>
3	<b>Doe Farm (kiosk / hiking trails)</b>
4	<b>First NH Turnpike Mile Marker (unmarked stone pillar)</b> <i>Hint: on Dover Road just north of Bayview Road</i>
5	<b>Mill Pond Dam (Oyster River)</b>
6	<b>Piscataqua Bridge Site (stone remains)</b> <i>Hint: the bridge ran from Newington to Goat Island to Cedar Point</i>
7	<b>Smith Chapel (stone building)</b>
8	<b>T.H. Wiswall Paper Company Site (foundation remains)</b> <i>Hint: Foundations in "John Hatch Park at Wiswall Falls"</i>
9	<b>Town Pound (stone structure)</b> <i>Hint: intersection of Durham Point and Newmarket Roads</i>
10	<b>Woodman Garrison Hearthstone Site (plaque)</b> <i>Hint: to enter the front door of ORMS you walk "right" by it</i>
