1	Davis Garrison Site (sign) Hint: hike the trail at Wagon Hill Farm along the water until you find the Old Gravel Pit
2	DHA Museum (brick building)
3	Doe Farm (kiosk / hiking trails)
4	First NH Turnpike Mile Marker (unmarked stone pillar) Hint: on Dover Road just north of Bayview Road
5	Mill Pond Dam (Oyster River)
6	Piscataqua Bridge Site (stone remains) Hint: the bridge ran from Newington to Goat Island to Cedar Point
7	Smith Chapel (stone building)
8	T.H. Wiswall Paper Company Site (foundation remains) Hint: Foundations in "John Hatch Park at Wiswall Falls"
9	Town Pound (stone structure) Hint: intersection of Durham Point and Newmarket Roads
10	Woodman Garrison Hearthstone Site (plaque) Hint: to enter the front door of ORMS you walk "right" by it
