

Eversource NH Vegetation Maintenance Program



- Eversource has 12,000 miles of road side distribution conductors that require cyclical maintenance trimming from our tree contractors to ensure safe and reliable service to our customers.
- Every year Eversource has 100+ professional tree contractors on our system trimming 2850 miles in communities all over the state of NH.
- The four year trim cycle of these facilities helps the daily reliability of the system also helps better prepare us against storm events.



Vegetation Impact on Reliability



Tree Related Outages

- 45% of outages on Distribution due to vegetation
 - +/- 20,000 annually
- 90% of outages during storms due to trees
- 12 Transmission disturbances annually




- Original recommendation: 137 trees for removal
- Current recommendation: 48 trees for removal
 - Current recommendation:
 - Identified dead = 10
 - Identified poor form = 10
 - Identified in decline = 13
 - Identified canopy structure = 15

Eversource Tree Trimming



- Eversource evaluates the zone above, below and to the side of the energized conductor.
- Maintenance trimming cycle is typically every 4 years.
 - New England vegetation growing at 2 feet per year over a 4 year cycle, results in an 8 foot side zone.
- Each individual tree along this project route has been carefully examined by professional arborists on multiple occasions to determine what work is necessary.
- The following factors were taken into consideration as part of this assessment:
 - Signs of decline, defect or weakness.
 - Overall poor form
 - Canopy structure
 - Tree mortality

Scheduled Maintenance Trimming

Reason for Request: Decline



Tree shows sign of stress or "die back" in the canopy. (I.e. parts of the canopy are losing their leaves) Many of these trees are affected by several problems weather, plow or automobile damage, wood decay fungi, insect or disease issues being part of the roadside forest has inherent stress.

Reason for Request: Poor Form/Structure

Many White Pines have been affected by the White Pine Weevil which affects the terminal shoot. This causes another branch to take over as the dominant leader but it is never as strong as the original



Reason for Request: Canopy Form

- Photo-tropism is the term for growing towards sunlightmany of us have experienced it with houseplants where we have to rotate the pot or put in in another spot.
- Trees obviously cannot rotate so the growth continues to extend towards the light which can affect the form, strength, aesthetics and integrity of the tree



Reason for Request: Tree Mortality



Removal of several dead or dying trees will not only benefit the future reliability of the electrical system but will also be a direct safety benefit to the community
