Underbrush -- Query: Should Eversource document for the Planning Board the \*specific reason\* why underbrush should be removed in specific places, and those places be identified precisely on a map? That could proof instructive when the next Eversource review occurs, as well as give the Town a heads up

to monitor the areas if invasive species to emerge.

Invasive species -- Is Eversource qualified to submit a plan for addressing this potentiality, or should this task be further outsourced to an expert at Eversource's expense?

### 2) TREE TRIMMING

Clearance standard (box) -- \*The natural canopy of the roadside forest on Durham Point Rd will be considered during Eversource's decision-making process.\* Please consider substituting:

\*Protecting the natural canopy over Durham Point Road shall be a prime consideration during Eversource's decision-making process.\*

[Use of the word \*shall\* denotes an obligation by Eversource.]

### 3) PROCESS

Oversight by Eversource arborists -- \*New Hampshire Certified Arborists Dave Burleigh, Ian Farley and Bob Allen meet the crew each morning and discus the daily scope of work.\* << MISSING WORD \*WILL\* BEFORE WORD \*MEET\*

Procedure if problems arise. -- HOW will the Planning Board voice concerns (presumably via email or phone to the Town Planner)? Will the public be notified of specifics by the Town Planner? Is there a backup plan, should the Town Planner be unreachable?
