## **ZONING BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT**

RE: PUBLIC HEARING on a petition submitted by Thomas & Elizabeth Richardson, Durham, New Hampshire, for an APPLICATION FOR VARIANCES from Article II, Section 175-7 and Article XII, Section 175-54 of the Zoning Ordinance to allow for the construction of a fence eightfeet in height along the rear property line with U.S. Route 4. The property involved is shown on Tax Map 10, Lot 12-8, is located at 11 Littlehale Road; and is in the Residence A Zoning District.

## DECISION OF THE BOARD

After review of the pertinent sections of the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Durham, and after full consideration of the evidence submitted by Iren B. Bragdon and testimony given at Public Hearings on July 8, 2014 and August 12, 2014 a motion was made and seconded:

that the Zoning Board of Adjustment approve a petition submitted by Thomas & Elizabeth Richardson, Durham, New Hampshire, for an APPLICATION FOR VARIANCES from Article II, Section 175-7 and Article XII, Section 175-54 of the Zoning Ordinance to allow for the construction of a fence eight-feet in height, with allowance to ten-feet for grade changes, along the rear property line with U.S. Route 4 with the fence to be built of organic materials and remain a natural color.

The motion PASSED on	a vote of 5-0-0 and the application for variances was granted.
